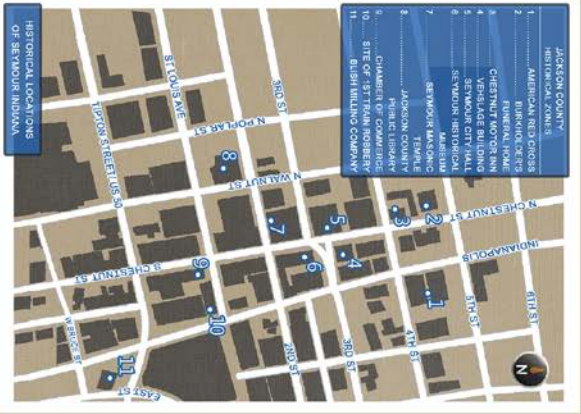

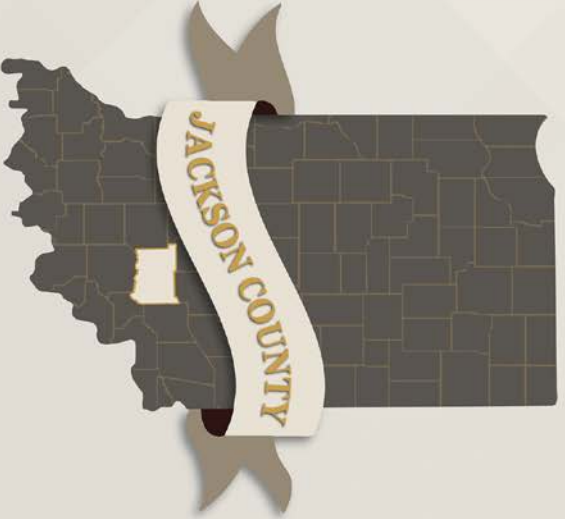


**LJC** LEADERSHIP JACKSON COUNTY

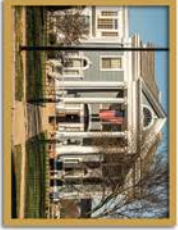


# GUIDED WALKING TOUR

SEYMOUR MAIN STREET



**1.) 410 INDIANAPOLIS AVENUE**  
 JACKSON COUNTY CHAPTER, AMERICAN RED CROSS, IS SENAMOUR'S OLDEST BUILDING STILL STANDING. THE RESIDENCE WAS BUILT IN 1851 BY TRAVIS CARTER. CARTER WAS SENAMOUR'S FIRST POSTMASTER, OPERATING THE POST OFFICE IN AN IPOSTAUS BEDROOM FROM 1853-1854.



**2.) 419 NORTH CHESTNUT STREET**  
 BIRNHOOLDERS FUNERAL HOME WAS BUILT IN THE LATE 1890S. THIS HOUSE WAS THE FIRST IN SENAMOUR TO HAVE ELECTRICITY. THIS HOUSE WAS ORIGINALLY BUILT AS THE RESIDENCE OF MEBBY S. BLISH, WHO WITH HIS BROTHER, TYTON, OWNED THE BLISH MILLING COMPANY. THE RESIDENCE WAS PURCHASED AND RESTORED BY VICTOR BIRNHOOLDER IN 1953, AND TRANSFORMED INTO A FUNERAL HOME.



**3.) 401 NORTH CHESTNUT STREET**  
 THE CHESTNUT MOTOR INN WAS ORIGINALLY BUILT AS THE HOME OF TYTON S. BLISH, CO-FOUNDER OF THE BLISH MILLING COMPANY. IN THE 1940S, THE BUILDING BECAME THE SENAMOUR HOTEL, AND IN THE 1960S, IT BECAME THE CHESTNUT MOTOR INN.



**4.) 300 NORTH CHESTNUT STREET**  
 VERSA-AGE BUILDING, FORMERLY ODD FELLOWS HALL, WAS BUILT IN 1882 FOR A COST OF \$8,800. THE LETTERS (O.O.F. (INDEPENDENT ORDER OF ODD FELLOWS) ARE STILL FAINTLY VISIBLE ON THE BRICKS OF THE SOUTH SIDE OF THE BUILDING. HENRY YEISLAGE PURCHASED THE FIRST TWO FLOORS IN 1889, RENOVATIONS IN 1924 INCLUDED RAISING THE ENTIRE BUILDING 3 FEET WITH JACKS TO ALLOW THE INSTALLATION OF A NEW HEATING BOILER. THIS BUILDING IS NOW RETAIL SPACE.



**5.) 309 N. CHESTNUT STREET**  
 SENAMOUR CITY HALL, FORMERLY THE SOUTHERN INDIAN TELEPHONE AND TELEGRAPH (STREET) BUILDING, WAS BUILT BY W.J. ARKHAM & SONS IN 1929. IT WAS NUMBERED THAT THE COST OF PURCHASING THE EXTERIOR TERRA COTTA TILES NEARLY LED TO THE STREET COMPANY GOING BANKRUPT.



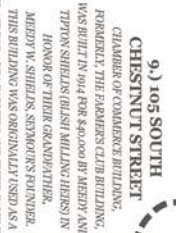
**6.) 220 NORTH CHESTNUT STREET**  
 FITTING HOME OF THE SENAMOUR HISTORICAL MUSEUM, FORMERLY THE FEDERAL POST OFFICE BUILDING, WAS BUILT IN 1918. THE POST OFFICE WAS CONNECTED BY A TUNNEL TO A LIVERY STABLE TO ITS EAST. TO ALLOW MAIL TO BE TAKEN TO THE BRIGGINS IN WHICH IT WAS DELIVERED, THE BUILDING HAS ALSO SEAWED AS SENAMOUR CITY HALL AND THE SENAMOUR POLICE STATION.



**7.) 210 WEST SECOND STREET**  
 SENAMOUR MASONIC TEMPLE (JACKSON LODGE NO. 146) WAS BUILT BY THE TRAVIS CARTER COMPANY IN 1901. THE TEMPLE WAS DEDICATED ON DECEMBER 2, 1901. IN 1979, LODGE #146 MOVED TO A NEW BUILDING AT 1818 N. EWING STREET. THE BUILDING IS NOW RETAIL SPACE.



**8.) 303 WEST SECOND STREET**  
 JACKSON COUNTY PUBLIC LIBRARY WAS BUILT IN 1904 FOR THE COST OF \$10,000 OBTAINED VIA A CARNEGIE GRANT. SENAMOUR RECEIVED THE GRANT IN 1903 AND THE LIBRARY BUILDING WAS COMPLETED BY THE TRAVIS CARTER CO. IN 1905. THE BUILDING WAS RENOVATED AND EXPANDED IN 1928, 1992, AND 2005. THE ORIGINAL ENTRANCE, WHICH FACES 2ND ST., IS NOW A GARDEN FEATURE.



**9.) 105 SOUTH CHESTNUT STREET**  
 CHAMBER OF COMMERCE BUILDING, FORMERLY THE PLAYERS CLUB BUILDING, WAS BUILT IN 1914 FOR \$40,000 BY MEBBY AND TYTON SHIELDS (BLISH MILLING HIERS) IN HONOR OF THEIR GRANDFATHER, MEBBY W. SHIELDS, SENAMOUR'S PIONEER. THIS BUILDING WAS ORIGINALLY USED AS A PLACE FOR AREA FARMERS AND THEIR FAMILIES TO SOCIALIZE, ESPECIALLY DURING HARVEST SEASONS, WHEN THESE WERE LONG HOURS AT THE MILL FOR GRAIN PROCESSING. PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY VISITED THE BUILDING ON APRIL 29, 1960 DURING HIS PRESIDENTIAL CAMPAIGN.



**10.) THE CORNER OF INDIANAPOLIS AND ST. LOUIS STREETS**  
 SENAMOUR TRAIN DEPOT-SITE OF THE FIRST TRAIN ROBBERY. AFTER A TWO-YEAR CRIME SPREE ON THE NIGHT OF OCTOBER 6, 1866, JOHN AND SIMON RENO, ALONG WITH A MAN NAMED FRANK SPARKS, BOARDED THE ESTROUBOND OHIO & MISSISSIPPI TRAIN AT THE SENAMOUR DEPOT. ONCE ON BOARD, THE THREE MASKED MEN MADE THEIR WAY TO THE EXPRESS CAR, HELD A GUN ON THE MESSENGER AND STOLE SOME \$12,000. AFTERWARDS, THEY PULLED THE BELL ROPE TO SIGNAL THE ENGINEER TO STOP THE TRAIN AND JUMPED OFF INTO THE DARKNESS WHEN THE TRAIN SLOWED. OVER THE NEXT FEW WEEKS, A NUMBER OF THE GANG MEMBERS WERE CAPTURED. VIGILANTES LYNCHED SIX GANG MEMBERS IN TWO SEPARATE INCIDENTS IN SENAMOUR. AT WHAT HAS BECOME KNOWN AS HANGMAN CROSSING, BECAUSE OF THE LYNCHINGS, OTHER GANG MEMBERS ARRESTED WERE SENT TO THE FLOYD COUNTY JAIL IN NEW ALBANY, INDIANA. ON DECEMBER 11, 1868, 65 MEN TRAVELED TO NEW ALBANY BY TRAIN. SHOT THE SHERIFF IN THE ARM, AND FORCED THE SHERIFFS WIFE TO GIVE THEM THE JAIL KEYS. THEY LYNCHED 4 ADDITIONAL GANG MEMBERS, INCLUDING FRANK RENO AND CHARLIE ANDERSON.



**11.) EAST ST. BETWEEN U.S. HWY. 50 AND W. BRUCE ST.**  
 FOUNDED BY MEBBY AND TYTON BLISH IN 1858, THE MILLING COMPANY OPERATED AT THIS SITE UNTIL A FEW YEARS BEFORE ITS DISSOLUTION IN 1876. THE MILL PRODUCED ITSELF ON THE PRODUCTION OF "TODONAL FLOUR" - AMERICA'S FINEST FLOUR. THE GRANT CONCRETE BINS STAND AS A MONUMENT TO THIS PIONEER INDIANA INDUSTRY.
